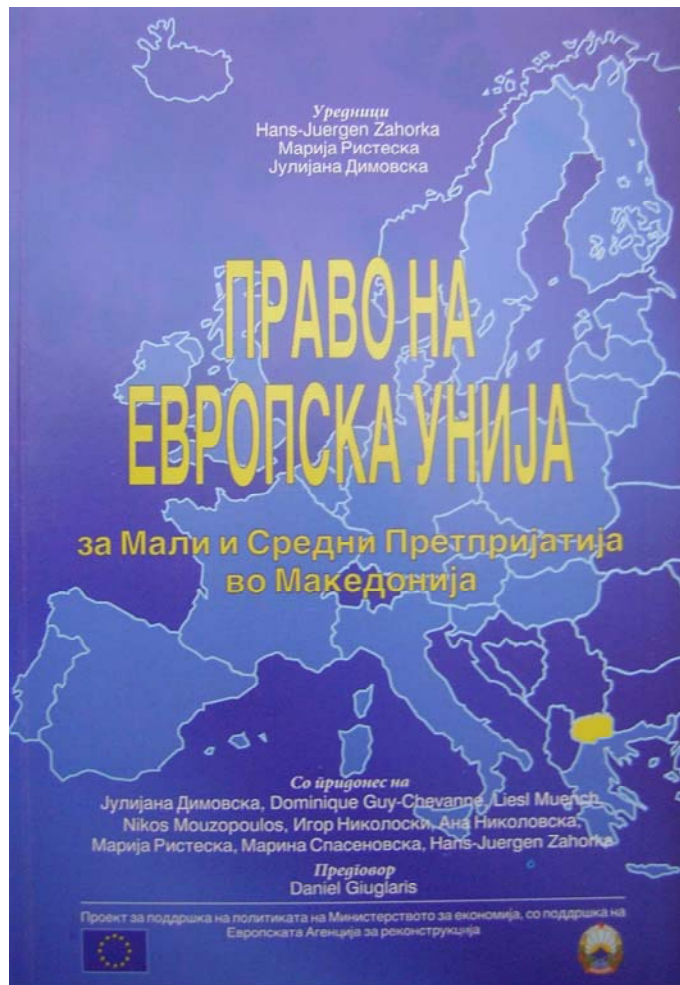

Businesses from this Balkan country will have to adapt the rules of the EU Single Market, as Macedonia has also applied for EU membership in March 2004. This book describes some basics of EU law, with special respect to Macedonian SMEs. As this is quasi the whole of the country's

economy, it concerns really everybody. Ten high-profiled authors contributed to this book, from a short guide through EU institutions, the EU and the Macedonian definition of SMEs, fundamentals of EU law, access to justice, the Single Market principles, the four freedoms (goods, services, capital, persons), technical standards and product liability, but also on mediation as way of dispute settlement, EU competition and company law in new Macedonian legislation, the access to finance for Macedonian businesses, the European Charter for SMEs, the activities of the Euro Info Correspondence Centre etc. The head of the European Agency of Reconstruction in Skopje, Daniel Giuglaris, contributed a foreword.
